The Mission Ministries Team met Sunday, June 10 at 11:30am. In attendance were Laura Henrikson and Marie Marr.

Laura opened by reading a letter from Straight Ahead Ministries, which included a prayer for help in day-to-day ministry. A review of the correspondence included appeals from Monadnock Center for Violence Protection and New Hampshire Prison Ministries. Of particular interest was a letter from Joy E. McCahon, of Rindge who has become a member of the fulltime InterVarsity Campus Ministry staff. She reported that Franklin Pierce InterVarsity Club became official in January and eight members traveled to New Orleans during spring break to volunteer with Habitat for Humanity. She is fundraising for next year's budget and this could be a good opportunity for a mission program.

Laura reported that Coffee Sales from the May 27th Fellowship Hour totaled \$67.68. We will need to place a small order soon.

It was decided to donate the proceeds from the Ice Cream sales at the July Family Festival to Habitat for Humanity. A local program was wanted and Habitat is building a house in Alstead in August. Help from the entire congregation will be needed to staff the ice cream booth and sign up sheets will be put out on June 24 and July 1.

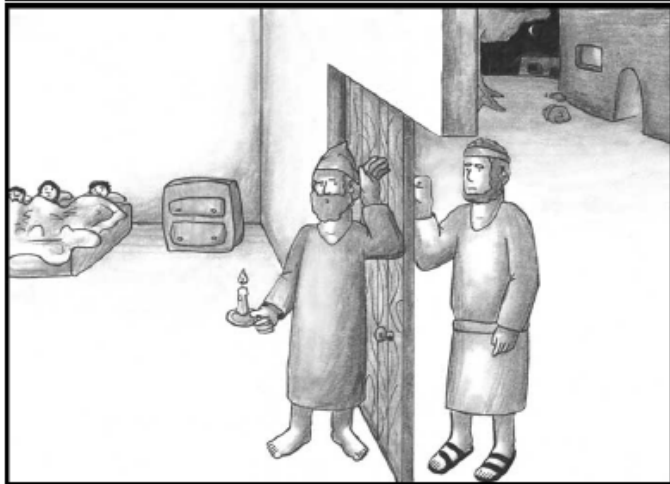
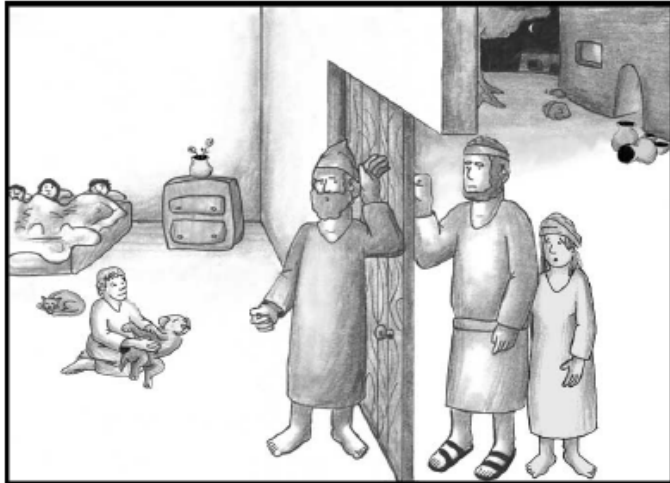

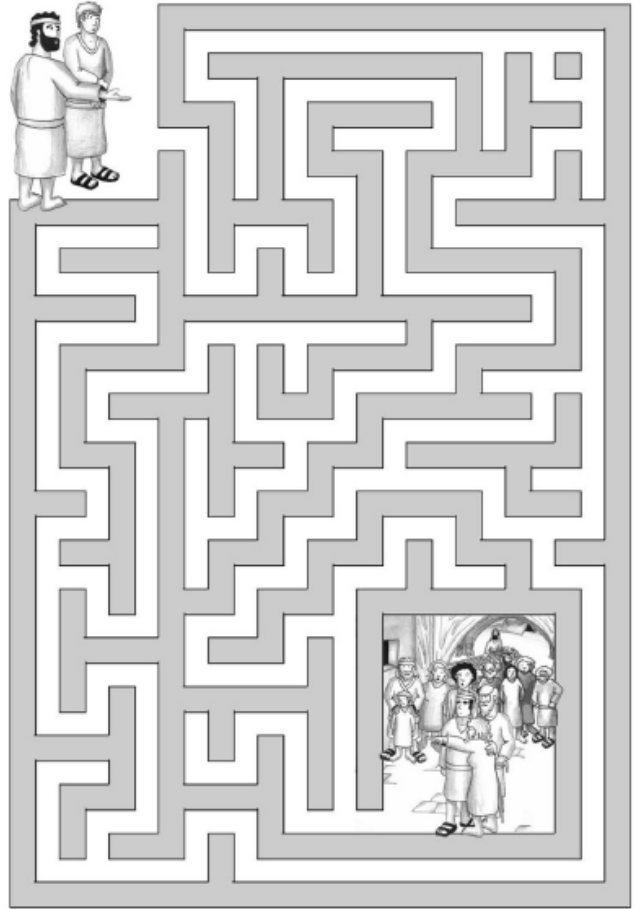

BOOK TALK

There are so many reasons to join a book discussion group. They can be an excellent way to enjoy books more and challenge your mind; they can also encourage you to read more, or to read books that you might not normally choose. In short, most participate in order to have fun, make friends, stimulate the brain cells and be exposed to new ideas and differing viewpoints.

The next book selection will be *Flyboys: A True Story of Courage* by James Bradley. Phyllis Ames will be hosting the discussion session at her home on **Tuesday, August 21 at 7PM.**

Three other titles have been selected for future book discussions ...good suggestions for summer reading! In mid-November, we'll be talking about the novel *Gilead* by Marilynne Robinson, late February will center on *The Life of Pi* by Yann Martel, and in mid-May our attention will be focused on *The Road* by Cormac McCarthy. Future Deacons will include some background information on these titles and authors, as well as discussion guides for each.

Many people like to get their own copy of the book so they can mark them up or read at their own pace. However, the town library will make every effort to gather a handful of additional copies of each title from the state library or local towns for one month before the discussion date that can be checked out and shared through a church contact person.

If you have titles you would suggest for future book choices, please give the information to a council member. Titles to date to be considered for future selections include *Wartime Lies* by Louis Bagley; *The Alchemist* by Paulo Coelho; *Suncatchers* by Jamie Langston Turner; *Peace Like a River* by Leif Enger; *The Kite Runner* by Kkhlaid Hosseini; *The Boy in the Striped Pajamas* by John Boyne; *Flags of Our Fathers* by James Bradley and Ron Powers; *The Things They Carried* by Tim O'Brien; *The Poisonwood Bible* by Barbara Kingsolver; *Nineteen Minutes* by Jodi Picoult; *The Handmaid's Tale* by Margaret Atwood; *Seabiscuit* by Laura Hillenbrand; *Crow Lake* by Mary Lawson; *A Journey to the Heart of Three Faiths* by Bruce Feiler; *My Sister's Keeper* by Jodi Picoult; *The Faith Club* by Idliby, Oliver, and Warner; *Lamb* by Christopher Moore. We have information on the title and author as well as discussion guides available for each of these recommendations.

If you are willing to co-host the mid-November, late February, or mid-May book discussions, please speak with Janet Goodrich.

Discussion Guide

1. Where do you see heroism in this book?
2. Were the airmen able to maintain integrity in the face of battle?
3. What are some everyday ways you can become a hero? What hurdles stand between you and living this way? How can you draw strength from God to live with heroic integrity?
4. What position do people typically assume Christians take in regards to war? What position do you take? How did you arrive at that position? Did this book cause you to rethink your position?
5. Does the Bible have a hard rule for every war? If it does, what is it? If not, how does a person discern the proper response?
6. Why does God allow such horrific wars and injustices to go on throughout history?
7. What did the Japanese and American soldiers have in common?
8. How has this book changed or enhanced your view of the events it portrays? Did the book seem adequately researched?
9. How well does the author convey the era in which the events take place? Did the author provide enough information for you to understand the relevance of these events in a larger historical context?
10. What did you learn about the time period in which the book is set that you did not previously know?
11. Discuss the author's use of language and writing style. Does the book read like a collection of facts or more like a well-written, engaging narrative?
12. What did you find to be the most interesting events in this book? What, if anything, surprised you?
13. What impact did the events in this book have on the course of history?
14. Did this book inspire you to want to do more research on the subject and time period discussed? What have you learned?

Retreat – May 2007 – Sharing your Song

As promised, we are publishing various aspects of our family retreat throughout the year. Here's an enlightening activity that everyone had fun with!

One of the first exercises that Nancy led us through helped us to define one aspect of our faith story. During this activity we thought about what our faith "song" might be or sound like. Some of us actually found a song or hymn that clarified what we felt in our hearts. Others found words, colors and emotions to describe their song. Putting these on paper through drawings was, for some of us, a challenge! However, in sharing our "songs" with each other, we began to practice telling our faith story...we began to evangelize! And it was easy!

Then, together, we identified some of the many benefits to sharing our story with each other:

- Clarifies or deepens our own beliefs
- Helps someone
- Provides hope when you can give nothing else
- Offers up the willingness to listen
- Adds an intimate aspect to the relationship
- Shows respect
- Provides satisfaction for the giver
- Feels like a gift to each other
- Provides opportunity for a connection between two people
- Helps each person realize that he's not alone, that others may have the same feelings, questions or doubts
- Provides joy

Can you think of other benefits from opening up you heart and sharing a piece of you faith journey with others?
