**January 11 – Ameranouche** The Ameranouche Trio features guitarists Richard Sheppard, Ryan Flaherty and bassist Xar Adelberg. The nationally acclaimed Gypsy Jazz ensemble plays acoustic hot jazz, both original compositions and unique arrangements by American and Gypsy songwriters, many in the style of Django Reinhardt. The music is universal and reaches diverse audiences worldwide.

Richard Sheppard plays lead guitar for Ameranouche: "His fingers dart across the strings faster than hummingbirds wings" -proclaims Jon Nolan of the *Wire Seacoast Entertainment Magazine*. 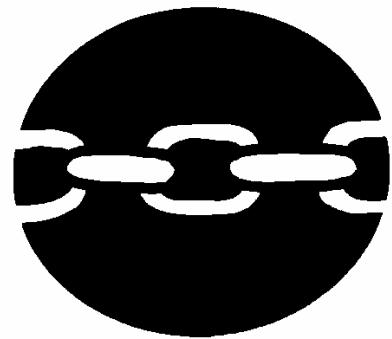

## Church Council Minutes October 18, 2007

**Present:** Jan Goodrich, Burt Goodrich, Jim Melhorn, Marcie Miller, Sue Campbell, Una Bigelow, Phyllis Ames, Margaret Morabito.

Following the opening prayer by Pastor Jim, the minutes of the September meeting were approved. See October Deaconer.

**Treasurer's Report:** See written report. Marcie distributed and reviewed the monthly financial statements. Pledge income was lower than expected in September, while investment income was slightly up. Total expenses were less than anticipated; however, we are still behind due to low income. We need to continue to be frugal. Burt mentioned that they would like to finalize the 2008 budget by the beginning of December. Burt and Marcie are available to meet with committees to discuss the budget.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Jim reported that we did not get the Lilly Foundation grant. More thought is being given to the idea of a sabbatical next year; this will be discussed again later.

### Old Business:

- **Safe Church Policy:** Pastor Jim continues to work with committees, in particular Pastoral Relations and Christian Education, to discuss the elements of the policy and develop certain forms that will accompany the final draft.
- **Turkey Dinner:** to be held on October 27; more servers are needed.

### New Business:

- **2008 Calendar:** Jan distributed the 2008 dates for Town Hall and kitchen use. Committees should review this and inform her as soon as possible if a change is needed.
- **Meeting House Calendar:** Marcie mentioned that this calendar could be very useful as a quick reference. Committees are asked to use the calendar and keep it updated.

### Committee Reports:

- **Deacons:** See written report. Sue reported that plans for the turkey dinner are going well. We are cancelling the "Upper Room" publication.
- **Trustees:** See written report. Burt reported that they are working on stewardship with a goal to increase pledges by 15%. They are

working with the committees in these efforts. Marcie mentioned that we have extra copies of the stewardship presentation given by Burt on Stewardship Sunday.

- **Membership and Evangelism:** See written report.
- **Mission Ministries:** See written report.
- **Music:** Pastor Jim reported that they are making progress in the search effort for a new choir director/organist. They will begin posting ads at the start of next year.
- **LVA:** Sue reported that they are continuing preparations for the Snowflake Fair, to be held on November 24. They have ordered the wreaths.

**Sharing Moment:** Marcie shared her impressions of the Paul Potts video, in which he sings opera on the British version of the American Idol television show. It is an inspirational performance.

**Closing Prayer:** Burt closed the meeting with a prayer.

### **Trustees Minutes** **October 9, 2007**

The meeting came to order at 7:05 pm with Burt Goodrich, Norman May, Marcie Miller, Cynthia Childs, Jane Hannon, Dave Marr, Rick Kohlmorgen, Jim Melhorn and Nancy Bogar present. Burt opened the meeting with a prayer.

**A.G. Edwards Account:** Win Brown and Lianna Poodiack came from A.G. Edwards to discuss our portfolio. Two small transactions were made with the hopes of increasing our interest income. Another motion was made and approved to transfer \$2,000 from our Money Market Account into our checking account.

**Secretary's and Treasurer's Reports** were accepted as presented.

**Stewardship:** Oct. 14<sup>th</sup> is Stewardship Sunday. There will be a Power Point Presentation, and

Lois May is organizing the soup luncheon. There have been "Stewardship Moments" – Marcie Miller spoke on Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, Janet Kohlmorgen spoke on Oct. 7<sup>th</sup>, Norman May will speak on Oct. 21<sup>st</sup>. and Burt and Jan Goodrich will speak on Oct. 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Buildings and Grounds:** There appears to be a bee infestation in the sanctuary. A call will be made to Robert Forest from the town to address this situation. We also need to do something about the windows – they do not close properly – perhaps weather stripping can be installed. The Oversight Committee has passed along the recommendations for the repairs of the building to the CIP Comm., and the town is looking at these various projects. The Bell Tower repair - cost \$100,000 – is the responsibility of the town. Painting of exterior building is \$60,000 – Church would be responsible for half, or one third if Ward Fund were used.

#### **Old Business:**

1. **Building and Grounds Point Person** – There needs to be someone who is responsible for overseeing the building. One suggestion was to break the building into parts – kitchen, Sunday school room, sanctuary and have various people look after them. This is stewardship month – perhaps someone would like to volunteer their talents. No decision has been made, but this continues to be an ongoing problem.

#### **New Business:**

1. **Organist Search Committee Budget** – After some discussion a motion was made and approved that the trustees appoint two people to meet with the Music Committee to go over their needs for their search. Burt and Marcie will meet with them.
2. **Budget process is beginning.** A suggestion was made that perhaps Burt and Marcie meet with all the various committees and discuss with them the process of building a budget.
3. **Ceiling fans** are needed in the sanctuary - a call will be made to Ellis Electric for costs.

Jim ended the meeting with a prayer, and the meeting adjourned at 8:25 pm. Next meeting will be Tuesday, Nov. 13, 2007, at 7:00 pm.

## **Mission Ministries Team**

### **October 28 2007**

The Mission Ministries Team met Sunday, October 28, 2007 at 2pm. Attending were Laura Henrikson and Marie Marr.

Laura reported that our new shipment of coffee, cocoa and chocolate bars had arrived. The cost of the chocolate bars and cocoa has substantially increased due to increased demand for organic cocoa products. Cadbury and Nestle have recently purchased organic cocoa suppliers and thus diminished the amount available to Fair Trade. Our prices for chocolate bars and cocoa will have to be adjusted.

Year to date expenses and deposits were reviewed in preparation for the dispersal of funds to various organizations. Mandated dues to UCC Association, Cheshire Association and the Monadnock Council of Churches total \$2450. It was decided to make a donation to Shelter from

the Storm, which is a new Jaffrey facility for the homeless. Additionally, donations were approved to Cheshire Chaplain's Fund, CROP Walk, Community Kitchen, Warming Families, One Great Hour of Sharing, Mississippi Christian Family Service, and Partners in Haiti. Marie will investigate if the InterVarsity Christian Fellowship at FPU is still active and if so, they will be considered for a donation.

The date of our next meeting will be decided later.

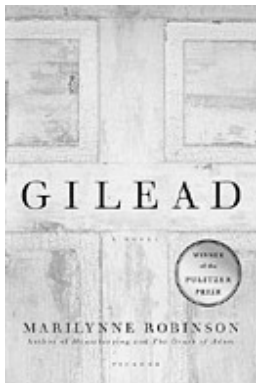

## BOOK TALK Selection for November 29

Marcie Miller will be hosting folks at her home Thursday, November 29 November for a book talk on **Gilead**, 2005 winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction, by **Marilynne Robinson**. Thanks to the efforts of our town library, copies may be available for loan in mid-October during coffee hour.

A brief summary follows:

In 1956, toward the end of Reverend John Ames's life, he begins a letter to his young son, an account of himself and his forebears. Ames is the son of an Iowan preacher and the grandson of a minister who, as a young man in Maine, saw a vision of Christ bound in chains and came west to Kansas to fight for abolition: He "preached men into the Civil War," then, at age fifty, became a chaplain in the Union Army, losing his right eye in battle. Reverend Ames writes to his son about the tension between his father--an ardent pacifist--and his grandfather, whose pistol and bloody shirts, concealed in an army blanket, may be relics from the fight between the abolitionists and those settlers who wanted to vote Kansas into the union as a slave state. And he tells a story of the sacred bonds between fathers and sons, which are tested in his tender and strained relationship with his namesake, John Ames Boughton, his best friend's wayward son.

This is also the tale of another remarkable vision--not a corporeal vision of God but the vision of life as a wondrously strange creation. It tells how wisdom was forged in Ames's soul during his solitary life, and how history lives through generations, pervasively present even when betrayed and forgotten.
