Our featured performer for **Friday February 8** is **Erica Wheeler**. Erica is an award-winning songwriter with five critically acclaimed releases to her credit. She has been featured on NPR's All Things Considered and WXPN's World Cafe. She is a favorite at clubs, coffeehouses and colleges across the country and has shared the stage with Shawn Colvin, Indigo Girls, Greg Brown and others.

Erica writes songs that are full of sharply detailed portraits of the American landscape and the lives lived there. Her music ranges in style from contemporary folk to country and bluegrass. Her voice is rich and warm, often conversational in style; her performances are engaging, inspiring and filled with hilarious stage patter and story.

"All Music Guide" stated that her songs combine "the literary sensibility of New England with the spiritual vision of the American west." The Fall 2007 issue of Yankee Magazine gave Erica's music the honored distinction of being named the second best thing about fall: "Best Soundtrack." Berkshire Eagle noted that "Not everyone can turn their impressions into three minute works of art that resonate with compelling truths. Erica Wheeler is one of the rare few who can."

Erica's music career began in Northampton, MA, an area known as "home" to a host of touring songwriters and a hotbed for the New England revival of the acoustic music scene. At a local club of national fame, (The Iron Horse Music Hall,) Erica quickly developed from an opening act into a headliner. She honed her skills there watching artists like Shawn Colvin, Mary Chapin Carpenter and Suzanne Vega. Erica was also a frequent participant in the Northampton Songwriter Group, which has included fellow songwriters Dar Williams, Cliff Eberhardt, Annie Gallup, Jim Henry and more.

Originally Erica entered Hampshire College (Amherst, MA) to become a wildlife biologist, but as she explains it, she "drifted over to the arts and humanities." Never leaving her naturalist roots behind, a "sense of place", connection to the land and metaphors drawn from nature have always figured strongly in her songwriting. It seemed obvious that at some point she would expand her career to include more directly her environmental interests and concerns.

She began to offer her hands-on workshop "The Soulful Landscape" to provide opportunities for individuals to access and articulate their stories of connection to place. Her songwriting and concerts, in response to witnessing all the rapid "growth" that had occurred in places she had visited in just her decade of touring, she began addressing more directly our collective sense of love and loss in regards to the land. After her concerts people would come up to talk to her, but instead of telling her about a relationship problem that was just like the one in her songs, they began to tell her about a piece of land that they wanted to save and asking her how. This gave her the impetus needed to take the next step. On her latest release GOOD SUMMER RAIN, she joined with The Trust for Public Land to work together raising awareness about land trusts and providing alternatives to "selling off the family farm."

Erica is currently based north of Northampton, in the small town of Colrain. She lives in a 100-year-old cottage beside a rushing brook, surrounded by a neighbors' 750-acre dairy and maple sugar farm. Living there keeps her grounded in her own "sense of place."

Church Council Minutes January 17, 2008

Opening prayer by Pastor Jim. The minutes of the December meeting will be addressed at the February meeting.

Treasurer's Report: See written report. Marcie distributed and reviewed the monthly financial statements. Overall income was lower than expected in 2007. Burt reported that they are fine-tuning the 2008 budget and will complete that by the end of January. The Trustees will be sending the entire congregation a letter related to this.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jim led an activity for determining core values of our Church, as a follow up to the "Parish Paper" article about this topic, provided in the January, 2008 Deaconer.

Old Business:

- **Files to Attic:** We hope to use the Church's attic for storage, subject to confirmation from the town.
- **Church Retreat:** At the Woodbound Inn on April 25-26.
- **Barnstormers Singing Group:** To perform in the summer of 2009 with profits going to the Church's General Fund. We need to set a date.
- **Music Director Contract:** Has been completed and approved by Music Committee.
- **"Prepared to Serve":** A training event for church leaders to be held in Pembroke, NH, on February 16. Tony and Pastor Jim will be attending.

New Business:

- **Church Wall Calendar:** Council dates for 2008 are on the calendar. Committees should post dates and times of events on this calendar.
- **Book Talk:** The Life of Pi is the next book. The group will meet at Sue Campbell's house on February 28.
- **Sunday School Room:** Needs sprucing up. This led to a discussion about the continued

need for someone to be the point person for building maintenance.

- **Building Maintenance Task Force:** Tony volunteered to gather members who are willing to participate in this crucial activity for our Church.
- **Warrant Articles:** To be read by Council Clerk in Sanctuary on Feb. 17, Feb. 24, and Mar. 2. This leads up to our Annual Meeting on March 2.
- **Pastor's Sabbatical:** This will occur during June, July, and August. Dates to be determined later. In preparation, the Deacons will assemble a worship team, comprised of volunteers who will do sermons on 11 Sundays during the summer. Pastor Jim offered to assist volunteers in their sermon preparation. The Deacons will follow up with more specific plans.
- **Big Picture:** Burt led a discussion regarding the role of the Church Council and its responsibility in planning the overall direction of our Church, as opposed to only facilitating meetings. We need to think of the Big Picture and look forward two-to-three years to see where we are going, where we want to be, and how to get there. What can the Council do to be more action-oriented? We need to empower our members to serve the Church. It was suggested that the Council should come up with a Leadership Team Task Force with goals being to chart a course for the Church and to find a point person to be a leader. We will continue this discussion at February's meeting.

Committee Reports:

- **Deacons:** See written report. Barbara reported that we are thankful to have Sue Chatwin continue to supervise the weekly coffee hour. The Deacons will be renewing the supply of small notebooks in the pews for our children. Please do not remove these useful notebooks from the Sanctuary. This led to a discussion of creating Church Boxes for our children to use during services.
- **Trustees:** Burt reported that Steve Henrikson will step down as Secretary on March 1 and Mary Jane Sawyer will step down as Sexton. We appreciate their efforts over the years. Thank you, Steve and Mary Jane! We will post ads for these part-time jobs in the Deaconer.

- **Christian Education:** Amy reported that the students are assembling Valentine's Day boxes to give to the local college students and the 1st through 4th graders are making cards to include. Thank you to our Church's young people for a wonderful Christmas Pageant!
- **Membership and Evangelism:** Marcie reported that we will continue Pulpit Proclamations during the Announcements in church on the last Sunday of every month. We are exploring a new outreach program, which will be a 12-week instructional program on the essentials of Christianity.
- **Music:** See written report. Tony reported that the Music Committee has some creative ideas for fund raising and that they are continuing their search for a Music Director. He presented a proposal which would allow each Church committee to develop their own activities to raise funds that would then go to the particular committee as opposed to going to the General Fund, subject to Council approval. Burt motioned that we approve the proposal. Discussion followed; the motion was seconded and approved.
- **Pastoral Relations:** Jan and Phyllis reported that the committee was discussing a timeline for Pastor Jim's sabbatical.
- **Men's Club:** Tony reported that they will meet next on January 20.

Closing Prayer: Tony closed the meeting with a prayer.

The meeting came to order at 7:05 pm with Burt Goodrich, Norman May, Marcie Miller, Cynthia Childs, Jane Hannon, Dave Marr, Rick Kohlmorgen, Larry Kabat, Jim Melhorn and Nancy Bogar present. Burt opened the meeting with a prayer.

Secretary's and Treasurer's Reports were accepted as presented. Motion was made and accepted to transfer \$3,000 from the A.G. Edwards account into checking account to cover 2007 outstanding bills and new January, 2008, bills. Marcie will call Win. Nancy presented information regarding last year pledges and this year. The statistic sheet will be included in Annual Report.

Old Business:

1. **Building and Grounds Point Person** – We are still looking for a volunteer.

Minutes of the December 6, 2007 meeting were reviewed and approved.

- **Church Council** – Jim led a discussion on a recent Parish Paper regarding Core Values –

what are our priorities. Christian Ed is finalizing college care packages. Youth Group taking more time to get started than expected. The attic space is being used for a more centralized document storage area. The annual Church Retreat will be held on April 25 & 26 at Woodbound Inn (costs being covered by an anonymous donor).  - d) Family Celebration RB Sandwich Booth. Celebration will be held in

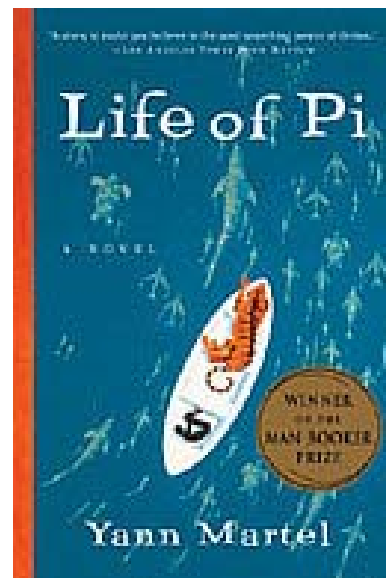
- the Center and not Wellington Park. Burt and Tony will lead.

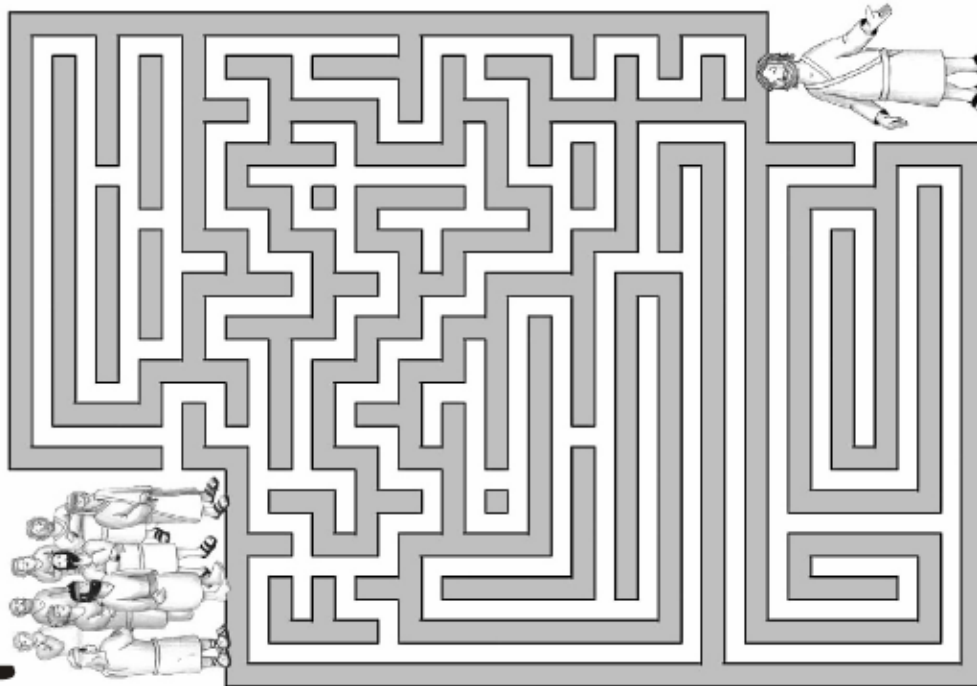
