Common Grounds Coffeehouse

Traditional Irish and Celtic band O'hAnleigh (pronounced Oh-Ahn-Lay) will be featured performers at a special St. Patrick's Day edition of Common Grounds Coffeehouse, Friday March 14 at 8 pm. The Middlebury Vermont-based trio will perform a range of music, from classic Gaelic ballads to rollicking pub songs, Irish-American 'tin pan alley' tunes, traditional dance sets, songs of rebellion, and songs of love and loss. Tickets for the concert are \$8, or \$4 with a valid HS or college ID, and will be available at the door. Doors for the event open at 7:30 pm.

The band got its start in early 2002 when Tom Hanley, a 2nd generation Irishman descended from immigrants from Counties Laois and Roscommon, was asked to entertain an audience at a St. Patrick's Day festival. Tom, who had been performing with a number of bands since the early 70s, was joined by his then 12-year old daughter, Becca as his 'front man,' counting on her ethereal soprano to evoke visions of Ireland past. For the next year, Tom and Becca performed at fairs, Irish clubs, farmers markets, and social events, while Becca's vocal depth and talents led to repeated slots in the Vermont All-State Chorus as well as performing the National Anthem at numerous large conferences and singing in choirs and as a soloist outside her O'hAnleigh gigs.

In early 2003, fiddler Cindy Hill joined the father-daughter team. Cindy's ancestors hail from Counties Tyrone and Limerick. Her musical credentials range from school orchestra and chorus to a succession of party rock bands, and her interest in traditional Celtic music sprang from her long political activism in the Irish independence movement. Cindy brings a knowledge of Celtic mythology and legends to the band along with her multi-instrumental talents.

O'hAnleigh's vocal talents – Becca's pure soprano, Cindy's smooth alto, and Tom's baritone – combine to create the unique O'hAnleigh sound. Their vocal diversity is supported with a dazzling array of instruments including 6 and 12 string guitars, bouzouki, mandolin, bass, fiddle, tenor banjo, penny whistles, harmonica, bowed psaltery, dulcimer, auto harp, bodhrans, bones, spoons, and a whole assortment of other small percussion, much of it hand-made out of odd bits of things found in the garage to get just the right sound for a particular song.

Church Council Minutes February 21, 2008

Opening prayer by Pastor Jim. The minutes of the January meeting were modified to specify that Tony is making announcements about the need for a maintenance point person.

Treasurer's Report: See written report. Marcie distributed and reviewed the financial statements. While income was a bit lower than expected and payroll was a bit higher than expected, we ended the month in the black which is good.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jim discussed the concept of asset-mapping through which we may categorize the assets of the church and match up strengths from the various categories. This allows us to more effectively get things done.

Old Business:

- **The Big Picture:** We will discuss this in April when we have our new Council members in place. This deals with gathering a group to explore our vision as a Church.
- **Sabbatical Fill-Ins:** The Deacons are seeking volunteers to lead the Sunday services during the Pastor's sabbatical this summer (except for the Communion Sundays which will be led by an ordained pastor). They have a sign-up list, to be filled in by the end of April.

- **Sunday School Room:** The ceiling tiles will be replaced and the room will be painted. We are seeking volunteers. The children will decide upon colors.
- **Secretary and Sexton Job Vacancies:** We need people to apply for these important positions, which will be vacant as of March 1. We will use temporary fill-ins to keep things going in the interim.
- **Prepared To Serve:** See written report.

New Business:

- **Deaconer:** We discussed the desire to provide the Deaconer through e-mail to as many members as possible, to keep costs down. We

also discussed reducing the content. Discussion to be continued next month.

get a task force together and discuss how to increase membership.

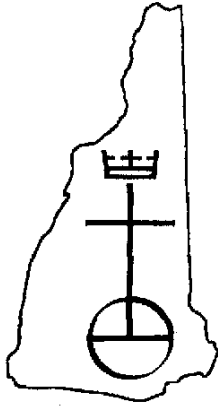

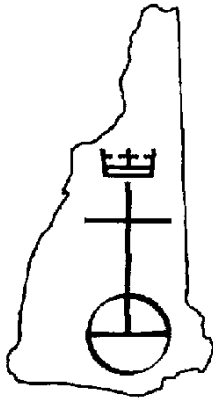

Dear Friends,

The New Hampshire Conference, United Church of Christ, has been in transition for a number of years. We have said goodbye to some beloved leaders. We have welcomed the Reverend Gary Schulte, our new shepherd, to our conference to begin a new ministry in a new structure. Conference committees and commission leaders have been working together to evaluate and improve our mutual ministries. During the last year, we have begun a search for a second shepherd as described in our ad in the UCC Employment News

The New Hampshire Conference seeks an Associate Conference Minister as second shepherd to care for and lead 144 churches. The position requires someone who will work in a collaborative style with the Conference Minister, local church pastors and Conference leadership to provide direction to the work of the Conference and its churches. Responsibilities will include working with local church search committees and Association Committees on Church and Ministry to help shape the call of skilled and courageous pastors for our churches. We are searching to call a pastor who passionately embodies the Gospel of Jesus Christ and is able to empower the gifts of God for the people of God.

We are pleased to present to you our choice for second shepherd whom we have come to know as a person of deep faith, wisdom and integrity. The Reverend Richard Slater, current pastor at First Congregational Church, UCC of Lebanon, New Hampshire comes to us with a emphasis on pastoral care to churches and pastors and a commitment to the work of the New Hampshire Conference. Richard is able to listen to people with differing viewpoints and help them find a way to work together. As a person with a long ministry in New Hampshire, he has a love for what New Hampshire's way of life offers. He has a commitment to social justice and finds ways to communicate his commitment in quiet but clear ways. He is a preacher and scholar who uses that scholarship well to underlie and enrich his message. He is a caring, loving person who is eager to work with Gary to care for the pastors and churches of our conference.

Richard was born into the church, the child of a Baptist minister, where knowledge of the Bible was of "supreme importance." Although he himself has "abandoned the fundamentalism of his upbringing," he has a deep love for the scriptures and has found them to be a fundamental resource for his life. Richard graduated from Gordon College, Gordon-Conwell Theological School and has received a Master of Theology from Harvard Divinity School. He began his ministry in New Hampshire at the Chichester Congregational Church, served for six years in a yoked relationship in northeastern Ohio and returned to New Hampshire to pastor the First Congregational Church of Lebanon UCC where he has just celebrated his 25th anniversary. He is married to Nirmala and is the father of four children, Nathanael, Joshua, Sarah and Anna, and, as he described himself, "the happy grandfather of two grandchildren, Maya and Lucia".

In response to your call, Richard and Nirmala plan to move to the Concord area, a move which will bring them a little nearer their two sons in the Boston area but a little further from their daughters who live in Lebanon.

With Richard's call as associate conference minister, our conference leadership will be complete, for the time being. As we have been led by God in the past, we are being led now, bringing us new leadership and new hope for the future. God is still speaking. We invite you to welcome Richard with your love, prayers and support.

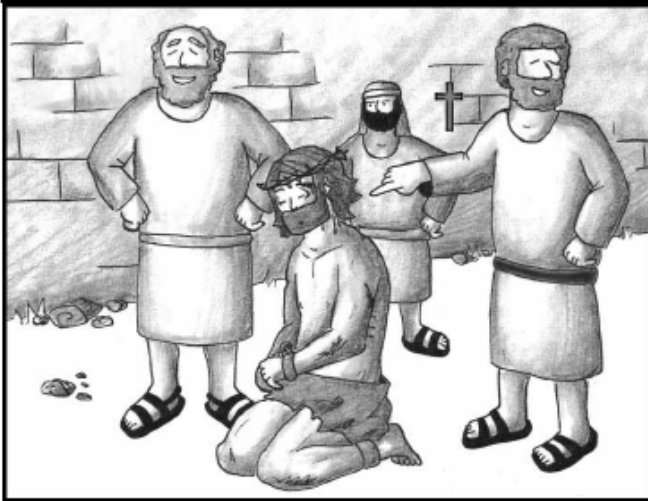
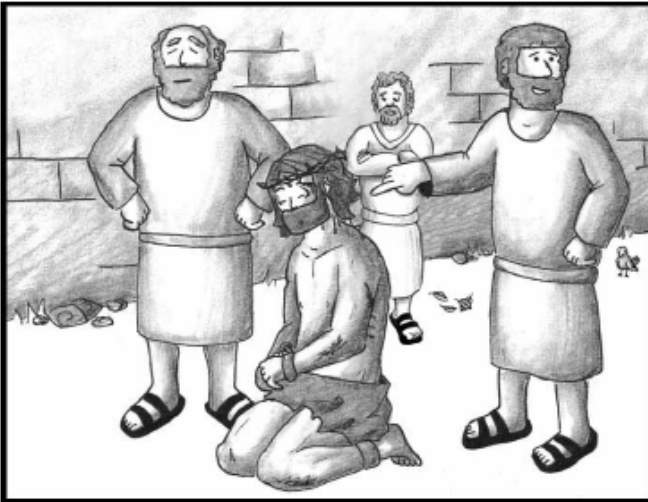

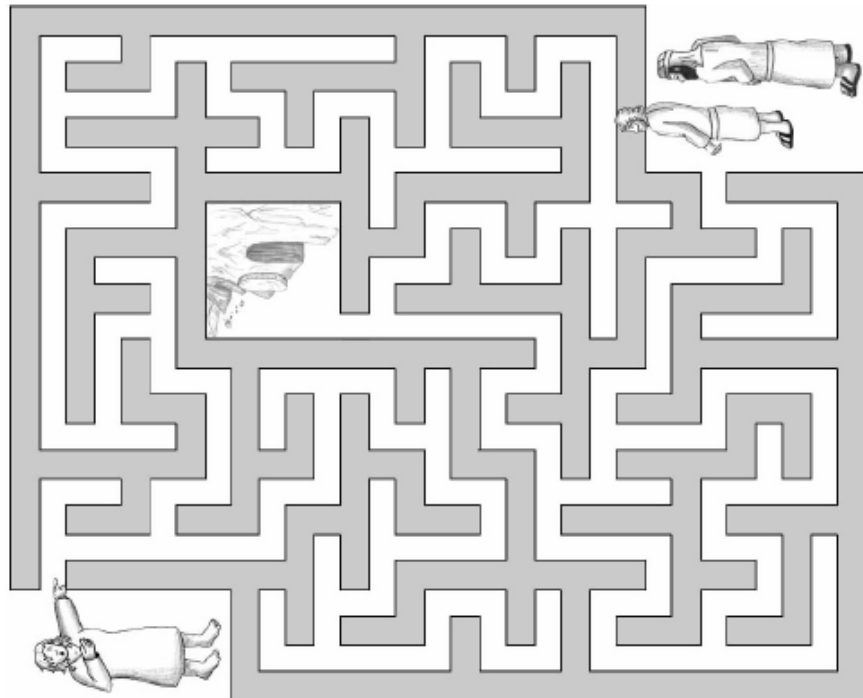
